The Epiphany of the Lord


From the Pastor's Desk

The word Epiphany means appearance, manifestation or showing forth. In the Western Church, the feast commemorates the coming of the Magi as the first manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. The Magi were pagans who did not know the true God of the Jews. Yet that true God revealed to them that the King he had promised to the Jews had come. The expected Prince was born. They came to Jerusalem, the capital of Judah, expecting, of course, to find the city and the whole country rejoicing. Instead they found suspicion and hatred in the reigning king---a hatred which in a few days turned to murder. King Herod, as well as other religious leaders, were so absorbed with the things of this world, that they could not recognize him. Like King Herod and the leaders of the Jews of his day, we also can become absorbed in the affairs of this life and the quest for wealth, pleasure and power. We could become so totally absorbed in such things as to have neither the interest nor the time to pay our respects to Christ or to welcome him into our homes and our hearts, as our true Lord. God forbid it should ever be thus with us.

From the Principal's Desk

Merry Christmas!

Let us always remember that Christ is the Prince of Peace and that he comes to reconcile us with God and others. Christ reminds us that peace is possible.

This school year we have been choosing a virtue each month to practice and focus on. In January we will begin the virtue of courtesy. Courtesy is the act of treating other people with respect and recognizing that all are made in God's image and likeness. Some ways to practice courtesy include letting others go first, letting others speak first, and making eye contact when speaking with someone.

As we begin the new year, our thoughts turn to Mardi Gras, which is right around the corner! St. Joseph's school will be hosting four baskets for the Silent Auction. The themes for the baskets are as follows: Mickey Mouse's 90th Birthday, Arts and Crafts, Family Game Night, and Paw Patrol. With the holiday sales it may be advantageous to begin thinking about and purchasing items for the baskets now. Please hold your items at home until further notice! Unfortunately we do not have extra storage space.

The end of our second 9-week period is on January 10. Report cards will be emailed to parents on January 15.

Winter is here! Please remind your child to bring their "Fab 5" (coat, hat, gloves, snow pants, and snow boots) each and every day!

As a reminder, when picking up your child from school, please refrain from parking in the handicap spots. These spots are made available to ensure equal and ample accessibility options for those with disabilities. Although you may only be parked there for a quick minute while picking up or dropping off your child, you may be taking a parking space for someone in need.

If you are dropping your child off in the morning before 8:10, please have them come in the gym door (door #5). This door opens at 7:45. Children can eat breakfast or sit and play games until the bell rings. We ask that you do not take your child to the classroom or to their lockers until 8:10. The teachers are using this time to prepare for the school day.

On Friday mornings, all families are invited to join us for Children's Mass at 9:00. Moms in Prayer, led by Priscilla Keck and Kristal Schmit, is held each Friday at 8:20 in O'Neill Hall. All moms who have children enrolled at St. Joseph's are invited to attend!

This week I would like to continue my catechesis on the Creed. *He ascended into heaven*. What we are professing in this article is rather straight forward. But why is this important? To understand the significance of the Ascension, we need to understand that it is intimately connected with Jesus's Cross and Resurrection, and that his action here closely resembles Jewish ritual sacrifice.

In the Temple there was an area called the "Holy Place" wherein there stood the Altar of Incense. Only Jewish priests were permitted to enter here. In the Holy Place was a veil, and behind the veil stood the Ark of the Covenant (the Ark was the "dwelling place of God," and although the Jews believed that God was omnipresent, they believed that he dwelt there in a particular way). This area was the Holy of Holies. Only the High Priest was permitted to enter there and he could only enter on the feast of Yom Kippur (the Day of Atonement).

On this day, the Jewish priests performed a ritual sacrifice at the Temple for the expiation of sin. A bull and a goat were sacrificed in atonement for the sins of the High Priest and his family and for Israel, respectively. After being sacrificed, the blood of the bull and of the goat were sprinkled to purge the inner sanctuary of Israel's sins.

How does this connect to Jesus? We know that Jesus offered himself in sacrifice on the Cross for the forgiveness of our sins. Furthermore, the Letter to the Hebrews makes it clear that the Tent of Dwelling (which preceded the Temple) was a mere copy of the true sanctuary that is in Heaven. It is into this true sanctuary that Jesus takes his blood in sacrifice before God his Father for the atonement of our sins.

Finally, the Ascension is closely connected to Christian hope. St. Paul tells us that all the Baptized are one body and that Christ is our head. Where Jesus, our head, has gone, the members of the body (the Baptized) hope to follow.
